Using Your Flash in Manual Mode | B&H Explora

The 1/2 setting on manual flash mode is simply 1/2 the power of the full flash. What begins to get tricky is that digital cameras don't have a built in flash meter. When shooting in manual mode, the exposure meter will guide you to the right exposure, but there isn't a similar flash meter for using manual flash mode. You can buy a flash meter or stand-alone light meter to help, but you can also simply experiment to find what works. Most of the time, manual flash mode is used to match the ...

Dial down your camera settings to reduce hot spots in the background, and dial down flash power for hot spots on your subject. Note – The Inverse Square Law and Flash Photography It is worth noting the inverse square rule with flash at this point in relation to the distance between your subject and the background.

Once you've settled on a shutter speed and aperture combination the next step is to set your flash output. Once you're familiar with your flashgun's output levels in Manual mode, this will become much more instinctive. As a starting point, try setting your flash to one quarter (¼) power at a distance of eight feet and adjust from there.

If we were to shoot in TTL flash exposure, then the distance we'd read for full manual power (1/1 setting), would be the maximum range for which we'd be able to get correct TTL exposure. You can see this for yourself by flipping between TTL mode and full manual power. The top value for or distance should remain the same.

By shooting in Manual Mode you have full control of your shutter speed, ISO, and aperture, among an array of other settings that can further fine-tune your images. Manually controlling the aperture, for example, can help you achieve those beautiful portraits with blurred bokeh backgrounds .

How to Shoot in Manual Mode Cheat Sheet for Beginners

It shows that the flash is in the manual mode with ISO speed 100. The zoom is set to 85mm and aperture is F11. The flash-subject distance is 4m which is about 12 ft. When the flash is set to the M mode, make sure that the FP indicator below M disappears and that the power ratio is 1/1 as shown in the image below.
